At the age of 25 I entered my first triathlon on the Gold Coast, 4.5 years later I have secured my Professional Triathlon License, where I am now wanting to further my career within the sport & represent my country on a national level. I have been training under Olympic & World Champion Coach Craig Walton for the last 1.5years, with the goal of taking my career to the next level.

With the help of PIVX so far, I have not only managed to customize all of my race kits, race bike to the PIVX Colours and Logos. I have also been privileged to travel across Australia to all of my racers during my 2019 season and represent PIVX.

My 2020 season has not exactly taking off as expected due to the sudden Covid-19 outbreak & lockdown rules. As per my previous proposal, the racers outlined, have either been cancelled or postponed. With that all said, I have been given some exciting opportunities throughout these lockdown period to race in the virtual world. I have received some fantastic local media exposure & also the opportunity to keep motivated and race athletes all around with world in my own back yard.

For those that don't know, I had recently competed in my first Professional 70.3 Ironman in Geelong, Melbourne with over 1500 competitors and thousands of spectators from all over the world, where I placed 8<sup>th</sup> out of 350 female competitors. This particular race was my first ever long course race consisting of a 1.9km swim, 90km ride & 21.1km run. I was able to come out of the swim in 2<sup>nd</sup> place, a close 5<sup>th</sup> place off the bike & I finished up 8<sup>th</sup> overall in my first Professional 70.3.

With that race, it has provided me a new and exciting pathway in my professional racing career. I have managed to race in the IronmanPro Virtual series over these past couple of months. The way in which that worked was, with all pools being closed they introduced a series that involved a different distance every week. First race was on a program through a virtual online program called "Rouvy" where I rode a 90km virtual circuit in Boulder, Colorado, a 5km run, followed by a 21.1km run. The run could be completed indoors or outdoors and could be done within 48hours of the start time (I have included some of the media clippings over the past couple of months that have appeared in our local papers and news)

With restriction now starting to ease in Australia & racers starting to appear back on the race calendar. This year now looks a little like; I plan on furthering my career into long course 70.3 racing.

- 11<sup>th</sup> October 2020 – Shepparton 70.3 Victoria
- 1<sup>st</sup> November 2020 – Noosa Triathlon

These events attract thousands of competitors and spectator around the world. They also give me the opportunity to provide maximum exposure & represent PIVX on a Professional level. All of these events are recognized as worldwide qualifiers for the World Championships & also receive huge media exposure.

My proposal for the next budget of three month of PIVX. I would love to continue representing PIVX as a sports ambassador for the sum of 1000 PIV each month for the next three months.

In return I will continue to upload a minimum of 2 posts a week via Instagram tagging PIVX and utilising the relevant hashtags. I will also continue to wear the PIVX logo apparel to training sessions, local events, media releases & all of my professional racers. The PIVX will be utilised to assist with my monthly travel expenses, training expenses, nutrition & creating more exposure in the world of Triathlon for PIVX. I also aim to boost my social media following, expanding into a whole new pathway in the world of Triathlons.

And finally, I just wanted to say thank you, for all of your support to date. With the help of PIVX I have managed to pursue my goals & hopefully this year with the continued support of PIVX, see PIVX represented on a World Stage in Triathlons.

## Virtually hard work

MAIGHAN Brown has taken on the world's best triathletes from the comfort of her Ashmore home.

The sport that once seemed virtually impossible is now virtually optimised.

Ironman competitors – including Bond University's Brown – competed in the first online competition at the weekend.

"Ironman has gone virtual,

which is the best news I've had in a while," Brown said.

"They have developed a program in which we sync our Garmin and heart rate monitors.

"It's exciting and the first time they've done it."

The competition worked with the help of wearable technology, heart rate monitors and smart training devices linked to online devices.

Essentially, it was the sport's answer to eSports.

Brown, part of Bond University's elite triathlon squad under head coach Craig Walton, is using the online event to continue competing during the COVID-19 crisis.

"It is such an amazing thing," Brown said.

"I adjust my training virtually sitting indoors in my own home and I'm talking to

my friends all over the world. I do a lot of my training rides on a virtual program called Zwift.

"I'll be riding in front of a laptop and I can see myself virtually and that keeps things a bit fresh.

"The most exciting thing for me is to have something to train for."

Brown said she was ready for lockdown with all the

training facilities she needed in her home.

"I don't want to waste the training I've done, so I get to implement it in a race, which is virtual. Who would have thought?

"The hardest thing about the race is mentally, because it's like a massive time-trial.

"There is really no one to match-race against, you have to be able to push yourself."

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
